This series will shine a spotlight on an extraordinary Canadian way of life – from the off-the-gridders whose sole source of resupply is the rail, to the hardy crews who do whatever it takes to keep these extreme railroads running. Featuring The Canadian Pacific Railroad – aka 'Rocky Mountain Railroad' - the country's oldest railway company and operated Canada's first transcontinental service between Montreal and B.C. in 1886. Its sprawling track – linking East coast to West - continues to be instrumental in connecting the west to the rest of the country. This line is the steel umbilical cord that ties Canada together. AND The Ontario Northland Railroad – aka 'Arctic/Polar Express' – runs through 1125km of dense forestland up to the secluded James Bay, the 'Gateway to the Arctic'. This line is the lifeline for many isolated homesteaders and townships that live in the extreme North alongside polar bears.
