THAT MEANS LOOKING AT THE WEATHER THE NIGHT BEFORE, PREPARING FOR YOUR TRIP. WEATHER CONDITIONS CAN CHANGE. WE HAD A PRETTY GOOD SO FAR. THE FALL HAS BEEN REALLY, REALLY WARM BUT THE WINTER SEASON IS UPON US, IT IS COMING. EVENTUALLY IT WILL BE HERE. WE HAVE TO BE READY.

>> Reporter: DON'T WANT TO BE SURPRISED.

WONDERING ABOUT RESPONSE TIME. SOMETIMES WE JUMP IN OUR CAR FIRST THING, HEAD OFF TO WORK AND DON'T REALIZE WE HAVE TO SLOW DOWN A LITTLE BIT BECAUSE THE ROAD CONDITIONS COULD CHANGE.

IS THIS SOMETHING YOU HEAR FROM DRIVERS?

>> ABSOLUTELY.

AS THE ROAD CONDITIONS GET COLDER, THE TIRES EFFECTIVENESS CHANGES AS WELL.

PREPARE YOURSELF BY GIVING WINTER TIRES PUT ON YOUR CAR, PREPARE YOURSELF BY LEAVING EXTRA TIME BEFORE YOU LEAVE THE HOUSE TO GET TO WHERE YOU'RE GOING, AND PREPARE YOURSELF THAT OTHER DRIVERS WILL BE DOING THE SAME THING AS WELL.

TRAFFIC PATTERNS WILL CHANGE AS THE WEATHER CHANGES'.

>> Reporter: OVEN PUT WINTER TIRES ON YET, THE ADVICE IS TO DO IT NOW YOU THINK?

>> I DID MY LAST WEEKEND.

ALTHOUGH IT WAS NICE AND WARM, IT WAS A GOOD TIME TO DO IT.

I DID MY LAST WEEKEND SO THAT I AM PREPARED FOR IT.

>> Reporter: HOPEFULLY BEAT THE LINES DURING THAT AS WELL.

LASTLY, I MENTIONED AT THIS COLLISION REWARDING CENTRE.

CAN YOU GIVE US GUIDELINES IF SOMEONE FINDS HIMSELF IN A COLLISION IN THE CITY, WHEN YOU COME TO A CENTRE LIKE THIS IN TERMS OF THE TIMELINE?

WHAT ARE YOU REQUIRED TO SHOW?

>> WHEN YOU COME TO A COLLISION REPORTING CENTRE IT WOULD BE BECAUSE THERE WAS NO INJURY AND

THE DAMAGE OF THE TWO VEHICLES  
OR ANYTHING ELSE IS OVER \$2000.

IF THERE'S ANY INJURY, ANY  
ISSUES WITH PEOPLES DRIVER'S  
LICENSE OR INSURANCE, TORONTO  
POLICE WILL COME OUT AND  
INVESTIGATE AT THE SCENE.

IF YOU ARE DIRECTED TO COME TO A  
COLLISION REPORTING CENTRE, MAKE  
YOUR CHOICES ON HOW YOU GET HERE  
VERY CAREFULLY.

IF YOU CAN DRIVE YOUR VEHICLE  
AND IT'S SAFE TO DO SO, DRIVE  
IT.

IF YOU HAVE TO HIRE A TOW TRUCK,  
MAKE SURE YOU SPEAK TO THE  
TOW TRUCK.

THIS IS A PRIVATE BUSINESS YOU  
GET IN THE TOW TRUCK, MAKE SURE  
YOU KNOW THE PRICES BEFORE YOU  
HIRE THE TOW TRUCK TO BRING YOU  
HERE.

THEY ARE REQUIRED TO GIVE YOU A  
COUPLE OF THINGS, INCLUDING AN  
INVOICE WITH A TOTAL ESTIMATED  
COST OF THE TRIP.

>> Reporter: GOOD ADVICE  
BECAUSE IT'S A LITTLE CHAOTIC  
AND STRESSFUL IF SOMEONE IS  
INVOLVED IN A CRASH.

MAKE SURE YOU OPEN THAT CAN  
INDICATION WITH THE TOW TRUCK.

>> ABSOLUTELY.

JUST LIKE HIRING ANYBODY ELSE  
YOU WILL GET AN ESTIMATE AND  
TALK TO A COUPLE OF DIFFERENT,  
YOU COULD DO THAT AT THE

>> Nick: THAT STORY WE TOLD YOU ABOUT YESTERDAY MORNING, THE FIERY CRASH INVOLVING A TTC BUS IS NOW RENEWING CALLS FOR JUSTICE FOR FORM ASKED HER TO PEOPLE IN THE CRASH WERE OUT ON BAIL.

>> IT WAS A CARJACKING FROM PEEL REGION AND THEN THEY CAME IN TO TORONTO.

TO HAVE THEM OUT DURING A CARJACKING AND THEN NUMBING TO THE CITY OF TORONTO DRIVING DANGEROUSLY AND CAUSING THE ACCIDENT, CALL IN ON THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO TIGHTEN UP BAIL FOR REPEAT VIOLENT OFFENDERS.

>> Jennifer: SECURITY VIDEO SHOWS WHAT HAPPENED AROUND 2:00 A.M. YESTERDAY AT BATHURST AND WILSON, WITH A BLACK SUV SPEEDING THROUGH A RED LIGHT FOLLOWED CLOSELY BY THE WHITE BMW INVOLVED IN THE CRASH. POLICE ARE STILL LOOKING FOR THE SUV, WHICH FLED THE SCENE.

>>> FIVE PEOPLE ON THE BUS, INCLUDING THE DRIVER, SUFFERED MINOR INJURIES.

FOR PEOPLE IN THE CAR WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED, INCLUDING TWO PEOPLE WHO HAVE LIFE-THREATENING INJURIES.

POLICE WANT TO SPEAK WITH ANYONE WHO WAS IN THE AREA AT THE TIME OF THE CRASH, OR THOSE WHO SAW A BLACK SUV AND WHITE BMW SPEEDING THROUGH THE AREA.

>> Nick: INTEREST HAS BEEN MADE IN CONNECTION WITH MULTIPLE EAST END BREAK AND ENTERS. 54-YEAR-OLD IS CHARGED WITH SEVEN COUNTS OF BREAK AND ENTER AND 21 COUNTS OF BREACH OF PROBATION.

POLICE SAY THE ACCUSED BROKE INTO A BUSINESS NEAR LOGAN AND DANFORTH EARLIER THIS MONTH AND STOLE SEVERAL ITEMS.

IT WAS LATER DETERMINED HE WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR SEVERAL OTHER BREAK AND ENTERS IN THE AREA. HE IS SENT TO APPEAR IN COURT TODAY.

LANES ON THREE MAJOR ROADS.

PRABMEET SARR CARIER HASN'T  
PROVIDED AN ESTIMATE OF HIS OWN,  
BUT HE BELIEVES THE PRICE OF NOT  
REMOVING THE LANES IS QUOTE FAR  
GREATER.

HE SAYS THE PROVINCE WILL LOOK
