

GOOD EVENING.

A TEENAGER IS DEAD AFTER AN EXCHANGE OF GUNFIRE WITH POLICE IN AURORA.

>> Michelle: NOW THE PROVINCE'S SPECIAL INVESTIGATIONS UNIT IS TRYING TO DETERMINE WHAT LED TO THE SHOOTOUT.

JOHN MUSSELMAN HAS THE LATEST.

>> Reporter: I SPOKE TO TWO NEIGHBOURS WHO LIVE RIGHT ACROSS THE STREET.

THEY TELL ME THEY SAW THE SUSPECT ARMED WITH A REPRESENT SHOOTING AT POLICE AND THEY RETURNED FIRE.

[GUNFIRE]

MORE THAN A DOZEN SHOTS RANG OUT IN THIS AURORA NEIGHBOURHOOD LAST NIGHT, AN EXCHANGE OF GUNFIRE BETWEEN FOUR YORK REGIONAL POLICE OFFICERS AND A 17-YEAR-OLD SUSPECT.

NEIGHBOURS WHO LIVE ACROSS THE STREET TELL CTV NEWS THE SUSPECT WAS HOLDING THIS SHOTGUN AND HE WAS FIRING AT POLICE.

>> DEFINITELY WAS SHOOTING BECAUSE I SEE THAT LIGHT FROM THE GUN.

>> Reporter: THE YOUNG 17-YEAR-OLD WAS SHOOTING?

>> YEAH.

HE WAS SHOOTING.

>> Reporter: WHAT WAS HE SHOOTING AT?

>> HE WAS SHOOTING AT THE POLICEMAN.

>> KEPT TELLING HIM TO PUT THE GUN DOWN AND HE WOULDN'T AND HE KEPT FIRING BACK.

THEN HE GOT HIT AND HE ROLLED OVER ON THE GROUND.

AND THE POLICE HAD TO DO WHAT THEY HAD TO DO IN ORDER TO TAKE CARE OF THE SITUATION SO THEY WOULDN'T BE THREAT ANYMORE.

>> Reporter: SHOTGUN AND A MACHETE WERE BOTH MARKED AS EVIDENCE AND REMOVED FROM THE SCENE BY INVESTIGATORS.

IT IS BELIEVED THIS ALL BEGAN AT A HOME AT 105 DOWNY CIRCLE AS IT REPORTED BREAK-IN.

THE ALLEGED GUNMAN CONFRONTED

THE POLICE ABOUT 30 METRES DOWN
THE ROAD.

BULLETS SMASHED THROUGH A
VEHICLE PARKED ON THE STREET AND
HIT THE BRICK WALL OF A HOME
NEARBY.

>> SOON AFTER OFFICERS ARRIVED
AT THE SCENE FROM YORK REGIONAL YORK REGIO
NAL

POLICE, THERE WAS AN EXCHANGE OF
GUNFIRE BETWEEN THE 17-YEAR-OLD
MALE AND FOUR POLICE OFFICERS.
THE MALE WAS STRUCK MULTIPLE
TIMES AND -- MULTIPLE TIMES AND
PRONOUNCED DECEASED AT THE
SCENE.

>> Reporter: WEEKEND IN THIS
NEIGHBOURHOOD NEAR BAYVIEW AND
SAINT JOHN SIDE ROAD CALLING IT
UNSETTLING AND FRIGHTENING.

>> WE SAW ON YOU'RE DOORBELL
COPS BANGING AT THE DOOR AND WE
WERE SCARED.

>> LOOKS LIKE IT WAS TARGETED.
WENT STRAIGHT TO THAT HOUSE.

NOT LIKE THEY WERE -- NOBODY
GOES TO A HOUSE WITH THAT TYPE
OF GUN FOR A BREAK-IN, RIGHT.

>> WE HEARD THREE BANGS OUTSIDE.
I HEARD MORE GUNSHOTS FROM UP
THE STREET ECHOING SOMEWHERE AND
THEN COPS HAD PULLED OUT GUNS
AND STARTED SHOOTING.

>> Reporter: THE SIU HAS TAKEN
OVER THE INVESTIGATION.
THE NAME OF THE TEEN SHOT AND
KILLED BY POLICE HAS NOT BEEN
RELEASED.

POLICE HAVE NOT SAID IF HE HAD
ANY CONNECTION TO THIS
NEIGHBOURHOOD.

AT LEAST ONE NEIGHBOUR WHO WAS
IN THAT STORY TOLD ME TODAY SHE
WAS JUST TOO UPSET TO STAY IN
HER HOME TONIGHT.

SHE'S STAYING SOMEWHERE ELSE FOR
A FEW DAYS BECAUSE SHE'S BEEN
TRAUMATIZED ABOUT WHAT HAPPENED
IN THAT NEIGHBOURHOOD.

BACK TO YOU.

>> Michelle: WE HAVE A
DEVELOPING STORY TONIGHT FROM
MISSISSAUGA WHERE A CHILD HAS
BEEN STRUCK BY A BUS.
IT HAPPENED AROUND 2:30 THIS
AFTERNOON NEAR LISGAR MIDDLE

SCHOOL.

FIRST RESPONDERS SAY AN 11-YEAR-OLD GIRL WAS HIT BY A MYWAY TRANSIT BUS WHILE CROSSING THE STREET.

PARAMEDICS SAY SHE WAS UNCONSCIOUS AT THE SCENE AND WAS RUSHED TO SICKKIDS HOSPITAL IN CRITICAL CONDITION.

THE INVESTIGATION INTO THE CRASH IS ONGOING.

LISGAR DRIVE REMAINS CLOSED TO TRAFFIC AT THIS HOUR.

>> Nathan: SEVERAL PEOPLE WERE TAKEN TO HOSPITAL AFTER A PICKUP TRUCK COLLIDED WITH A TTC BUS THIS MORNING IN NORTH YORK.

THE CRASH HAPPENED NEAR YONGE AND FINCH AROUND 42:50 a.m.

PARAMEDICS SAY THEY TRANSPORTED SIX PEOPLE FROM THE SCENE BY EIGHT WERE HURT INCLUDING BOTH DRIVERS AND SIX PASSENGERS FROM THE BUS.

ALL OF THE INJURIES HAVE BEEN DESCRIBED AS NON-LIFE-THREATENING.

A WITNESS SAYS HE HEARD WHAT SOUNDED LIKE AN EXPLOSION AND THEN SAW THE TRUCK DRIVER IN THE AFTERMATH OF THE CRASH -- AFTERMATH OF THE CRASH.

>> HE ACTUALLY LIKED LIKE HE HAD [INDISCERNIBLE] HE JUST LOOKED LIKE HE WAS JUST OUT OF IT.

I TOLD HIM TO SIT DOWN.

[INDISCERNIBLE] UP TO SOMETHING NEXT THING YOU KNOW I SAW THE GUY RUN.

>> Nathan: POLICE CAUGHT THE DRIVER AFTER A SHORT FOOT CHASE. HE WAS ARRESTED ON CHARGES THAT HAVE YET TO BE ANNOUNCED AND TAKEN TO HOSPITAL.

THE TTC'S INTERIM CEO SAID HIS THOUGHTS ARE WITH THE INJURED DRIVER AND CUSTOMERS.

CALLED THE INCIDENT A SAD REMINDER OF THE CHALLENGES THE TTC FACES ON THE ROADS EVERY DAY.

>> Michelle: YORK REGIONAL YORK REGIONAL POLICE CHARGED A SCHOOL BUS DRIVER AFTER A CHILD WAS STRUCK AND KILLED A FEW MONTHS AGO IN VAUGHAN.

THIS HAPPENED JUST BEFORE 8
a.m. JUNE 19 NEAR PIERRE BERTON
BOULEVARD.

WITNESSES TOLD CTV NEWS A
6-YEAR-OLD BOY WAS HIT BY THE
SCHOOL BUS WHILE HE WAS RUNNING
TO CATCH IT.

HE DIED AT THE SCENE.

A 65-YEAR-OLD WOMAN FROM VAUGHAN
IS CHARGED WITH DANGEROUS
OPERATION CAUSING DEATH.

>>> TORONTO POLICE CHARGED A
YOUNG MOTHER WITH MURDER AFTER
HER BABY DIED IN A WEST END
HOUSE FIRE.

EMERGENCY CREWS WERE CALLED TO
THE HOME ON TRETHERWEY DRIVE NEAR
EGLINTON A BIT AFTER 1 a.m.

LAST FRIDAY.

SMOKE COULD BE SEEN BILLOWING
OUT OF THE HOUSE AS FIREFIGHTERS
GOT THE FLAMES UNDER CONTROL.
THEY ALSO PULLED A 19-YEAR-OLD
WOMAN AND HER 4-MONTH-OLD
DAUGHTER OUT.

THE INFANT WAS RUSHED TO
HOSPITAL WITHOUT VITAL SIGNS AND
PRONOUNCED DEAD.

SEVERAL OTHER RESIDENTS GOT OUT
SAFELY.

NOW 19-YEAR-OLD KATHRYNN QUITA
BATUGAL IS CHARGED WITH SECOND
DEGREE MURDER AND ARSON AS THE
FIRE INVESTIGATION CONTINUES.

>> Nathan: STILL TO COME, AS
THE PROVINCE ROLLS OUT THE FINAL
PHASE OF THEIR ALCOHOL
AVAILABILITY PLAN, THE
OPPOSITION IS TAKING AIM AT
SLUGGISH HOUSING STARTS.

THE LATEST FROM QUEEN'S PARK
JUST AHEAD.

>> Michelle: TWO WEEKS FROM
TONIGHT TAYLOR SWIFT WILL TAKE
TO THE FIRST STAGE FOR THE FIRST
OF SIX SOLD OUT CONCERTS IN
TORONTO.

>> Nathan: THE CITY ANNOUNCED
THEY ARE ESTIMATED FOR THE HALF
A MILLION PEOPLE WHO WILL SHOW
UP FOR THE SHOW.

BETH MACDONNELL IS LIVE WITH
MORE ON HOW OFFICIALS HAVE
PREPARED FOR THE CONCERT EVENT
OF THE YEAR.

>> Reporter: THERE IS A LOT OF

EXCITEMENT ABOUT THE "ERAS" TOUR
COMING TO TORONTO.

THE CITY IS ANTICIPATING 500,000
PEOPLE FLOWING INTO THE CITY,
WHICH MEANS THERE ARE SOME BIG
PLANS TO KEEP PEOPLE SAFE AND
KEEP PEOPLE MOVING AS BEST AS
POSSIBLE.

>> MY NAME IS TAYLOR SWIFT AND
WELCOME TO THE "ERAS" TOUR.

>> Reporter: STARTING NOVEMBER 14 IT'S TOR
ONTO'S TURN

FOR THE "ERAS" TOUR, A SIX SHOW
RUN, THE MOST ANYWHERE, SECOND
ONLY TO LONDON IN THE UK.

WITH HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS OF
PEOPLE POURING IN, THE CITY HAS
BEEN WORKING TO MAKE SURE
EVERYTHING RUNS SAFELY AND
SMOOTHLY.

>> I WANT YOU TO KNOW THAT WE'RE
READY FOR IT.

>> Reporter: TO MANAGE CROWDS
AND CONGESTION, OFFICIALS HAVE
BEEN COORDINATING WITH VENUES
DOWNTOWN AND WILL BE ACTIVATING
THE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTRE
TO COORDINATE CITY SERVICES AND
RESPONSES.

THERE WILL NOT BE A FAN ZONE IN
THE CORE.

AND WITH 50,000 PEOPLE SEEING
THE SHOW PER NIGHT, SEVERAL ROAD
CLOSURES AROUND ROGERS CENTRE
WILL BE IN PLACE, INCLUDING A
YELLOW ZONE WITH LIMITED
ACTIVITY AND A RED ZONE WITH
ACCESS MAINTAINED FOR LOCAL
BUSINESSES AND RESIDENTS.

THOSE WITHOUT TICKETS ARE BEING
ASKED TO STAY AWAY, AND EVERYONE
IS BEING ENCOURAGED TO USE A
RIDE SHARE SERVICE, BIKE, OR
TAKE PUBLIC TRANSIT.

>> UNION STATION WILL HAVE
ROBUST CROWD MANAGEMENT PLANS IN
PLACE AND WE'RE ALSO ENCOURAGING
PEOPLE TO CONSIDER USING OTHER
TRANSIT STATIONS, FOR INSTANCE,
St. ANDREW STATION, TO REDUCE
CROWDING AT UNION STATION.

>> Reporter: THIS SUM AREA
PLOT TO ATTACK SWIFT'S SHOWS IN
VEE ANNETTE VERSCHUREN IS ONE
EXAMPLE OF WHY TORONTO POLICE
ARE WORKING TO ENSURE SAFETY AND

TO EXPECT A SIGNIFICANT POLICE PRESENCE.

>> WE UNDERSTAND THERE MAY BE SOME ANXIETY AROUND EVENTS OF THIS SCALE 67 THAT IS WHY OUR INTELLIGENCE TEAMS ARE CLOSELY MONITORING AND FULLY PREPARED TO RESPOND TO ANY POTENTIAL RISK.

>> Reporter: WITH SO MANY FANS AND FUN ABOUT TO DESCEND THE CITY HAS BEEN STUDYING OTHER PLACES WHICH HOSTS THE "ERAS" TOUR ON HOW TO MANAGE THESE MAMMOTH EVENTS.

>> I'M THRILLED TO WELCOME TAYLOR SWIFT AND THE WORLD TO OUR CITY AND WE LOOK FORWARD TO HAVING A SPECTACULAR TIME.

>> Reporter: ON THE CULTURAL SIDE A BIT OF HOMAGE TO TAYLOR SWIFT'S LAST ALBUM, THE TORTURED POET'S DEPARTMENT, THERE WILL BE SEVERAL POETRY ACTIVATIONS HERE AT NATHAN PHILLIPS SQUARE AND ALONG TAYLOR SWIFT WAY.

THERE WILL ALSO BE A DROP-OFF AND PICKUP ZONE FOR VEHICLES.

NO PARKING, HOWEVER.
